2006/2007 TRAINING SCHEDULE FOR MISSION PEAK DISTRICT

PROFILE OF A TRAINED CUB SCOUT LEADER:

STEPS:

Step #1- *Cub Scout Fast Start Training* gives a leader an immediate comfort level in the program. A leader can complete this training by taking the self-paced online course at www.sfbac.org or viewing the Cub Scout Fast Start video. The Cub Scout Fast Start material covers position specific programs (den leader positions, cubmaster and pack committee). In Mission Peak District the Cub Scout Fast Start video will be available upon request for viewing at Cub Scout Roundtables (2nd Thursday of the month). Contact the Mission Peak Training Chairman to schedule.

Step #2 - *New Leaders Essentials Training* is taken once, either as a Cub, Boy Scout, Venture or Varsity Leader and highlights the values, aims, history, and methods of Scouting. This is a 90-minute training session. In Mission Peak District this course will be offered at the Merit Badge Extravaganza on 10/14/06 and the beginning of the Cub Scout Leader Specific training on 2/17/07.

Step #3 - *Cub Scout Leader Specific Training* provides specialized knowledge a new leader needs to assume a specific leadership role. Each session is approximately 2-3 hours long and is usually completed during an evening session or as part of a full day session. Mission Peak District will offer this training Fall 2006 as an afternoon session on 11/11/06 and in Spring 2007 as part of an all day session on 2/17/07. Note that the all day session includes New Leaders Essential training, which is taught in the morning followed by the CS Leader Specific sections in the afternoon.

Who should attend?

Anyone involved with Cub Scouts specifically Cub Masters, Assistant Cub Masters, Webelos Leaders, Tiger, Bear and Wolf Den Leaders.

Why should you attend?

Your time is valuable! You do not have to create a wheel to be the best and give your best to your pack and den! And every youth really does deserve a trained leader!

- Complete CUB SCOUT LEADER SPECIFIC TRAINING for your specific position. A new specific training is required when you change leadership positions.
- It is also strongly recommended that all adults working with boys complete YOUTH PROTECTION TRAINING. This is available online.

NEW LEADER ESSENTIALS

is the initial training for all adults serving youth in the Boy Scouts of America.

This course presents an overview of Scouting, including the organization's mission, aims, and methods. It also provides new leaders with a look at the resources available to them through the BSA and a clear understanding of Scouting's expectations of its adult leadership.



ROUNDTABLE

This monthly meeting provides all leaders with vital information about what's going on in Scouting.

Roundtable helps packs succeed.

At least one member from your unit should attend each month.

CUB SCOUT LEADER SPECIFIC

Once a volunteer has gained a solid overview of the BSA's values-based program through New Leader Essentials, he/she can begin training for a specific Scouting position through Leader Specific training.

This course provides the specialized knowledge a new leader needs to assume a specific leadership role.

Cub Scout Leader Specific Training has been developed for the following positions and their assistants:

1. Tiger Cub Den Leaders
2. Cub Scout Den Leaders
3. Webelos Den Leaders
4. Cubmasters
5. Pack Committee members

OTHER TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

Youth Protection

Our first job in Scouting must be to protect our youth members from injury and abuse. Scouting must be a safe and secure environment for everyone. Anyone who works with young people needs to know the facts and responsibilities of youth protection.

BALOO

(Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation)

This training is not required for all Cub Leaders, but at least one member of a Pack Committee (who is responsible for Pack Camping) **must** be BALOO trained in order for the Cub Scout Pack to be authorized to go camping as a pack activity.

Webelos Leader Outdoor Training

This training is a specialized course designed to give both new and experienced leaders a better understanding of the Webelos program and especially the outdoors program in preparation for the transition to Boy Scouting.
